Survey on Pregnancy Perceptions **Reveals Significant Access, Care and** Information Deficiencies in Europe.

Over 94% of women did not experience a trouble-free pregnancy.

The survey shows that across Europe there is still much work to be done to improve maternal care and the pregnancy experience for women. Only 5,6%* of the women in the survey sample answered positively for all the applicable questions/parameters*.

Access to information remains a problem

About **1 in 4** women sampled across Europe answered that they do not feel that they had the appropriate information and support immediately before and after giving birth.



Family planning is not a frequent topic of discussion with doctors

of the women in the survey responded that 57% family planning had not been discussed with their doctor. This was even more pronounced among younger women.

Giving vulnerable women a voice

vulnerable groups of women may not have been included in the sample. However, the fact that the vast majority of women surveyed did not perceive to have a completely issue-pregnancy experience would suggest that the situation would be worse for these vulnerable groups,

^{*} Examples of these parameters include perceived barriers to doctors or midwives, perceived impact on relationships (personal and professional), perceived discrimination in the workplace, and perceived appropriate access to information.

^{*}The survey was distributed via online panels to a representative sample of women in each country. The respondents completed a qualifying question designed to filter for women between the ages of 18 and 45, and who were at a particular stage of life (either currently planning a family, currently pregnant, had had a baby within the last 6 months or who have children). In total, 3270 women completed the survey.
